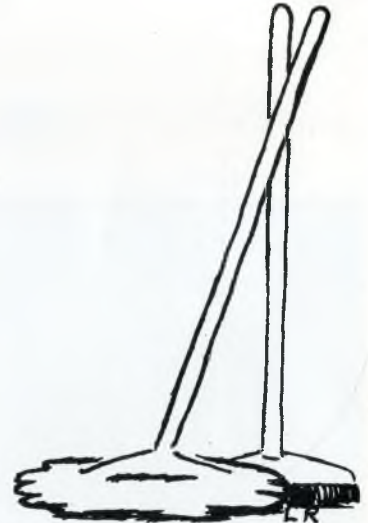

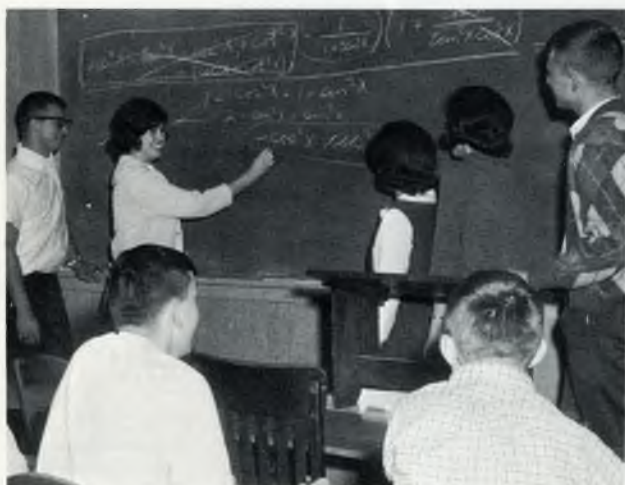

The Indians started off their basketball season with a revenge victory over South Central, one of the five teams to beat Culver last year. After jumping off to a first quarter lead of 21-9, the Indians coasted to a 76-51 win.
