

PENSION AND PROFIT SHARING PLANS:

Congress passed a law which became effective September 6, 1974, setting up the Employee Retirement Income Security Act. This Act sets up Federal requirements designed to protect Plan participants and their beneficiaries. Several changes will be made in our Plans, but it is interesting to note that any change being made will not reduce the present benefits to our Employees. In most instances these changes will reflect increased benefits to our present participants. Your Trustees hope to provide you with additional information as it developes and is approved.
