A FAMILY BUSINESS

"Annis Grocery in LaPaz is now being operated by the fourth generation of the family and present owner Bill Annis expects the business will be passed on to his sons. Bill and his wife, Sandra, have two sons; Jack, 17 years old, and Ted, 13 years old.

The store was founded 60 years ago by C. O. Leed. Ten years later Glen Annis, Leed's son-in-law, came into the business, and the store was known as Leed and Annis. Over the years there were several other parties associated with the store. Glen Annis took over the business about 1928, and operated by himself until his son, Barney, became his partner in the early 1940's. Even after C.O. Leed retired, he would come back and work in the store.

Glen Annis died in 1957 and Barney became sole owner until his sons, Bill and John bought him out in 1964. John died in 1969, and Bill became sole owner at that time.

The store was moved out of the original site in the 1930's; there was a major expansion in 1954, with several improvements made since then. In April of 1966 the LaPaz Locker System, in the south part of the store was purchased from Mrs. Edna Linn." *

The Annis name is known for quality foods not only in LaPaz, but in Lakeville where Bill and his dad have a grocery store. Bill's uncles have stores in Remington and Monon making the Annis name a household word in many Indiana homes.

When considered that the Annis family have been in the food business for over sixty years, that there are or have been 7 Annis men involved in the food business, and that this is the only business in which these men have been involved, one must conclude that it has been a good business for this family. A good business also for our bank as they have been customers as long as they have had their stores.

Al Cummins reminisced, "I've known the Annis family for many years. They have always been well respected in the LaPaz community. Barney used to sell groceries through the country side in a truck that was similar to the modern day motor homes. I can remember crawling up in his truck when I was a little kid in hopes that I would get to buy a piece of candy from him. Barney and Bill have given many hours of their time for the betterment of the community."

The huckster wagon or delivery truck was a grocery store in itself. "There was a shelf for bread stuffs, canned goods, dry goods,

dairy products in the walk-in van," Bill said. "I was only 5 or 6 years old when I'd go with Dad on the rounds of the farms close to LaPaz. Sure, Al Cummins was a good friend who usually got candy from Dad!" Bill considered, "Guess the farmers all got to know us pretty well in those days and still do business with us today even though the delivery days are gone. We do still deliver to people unable to shop for themselves "

Bill was sorry to say that their meat processing plant has been forced to close due to government regulations on butchering-processing. (Like all business the Nadarism in Washington touched this business.)

The Annis family have been customers of the Farmers State Bank for all the years of the business. With Bill Annis a director of our banks and Al Cummins the manager of the Farmers State Bank and vice president of all of our banks, the friendship of two men and two business continues
