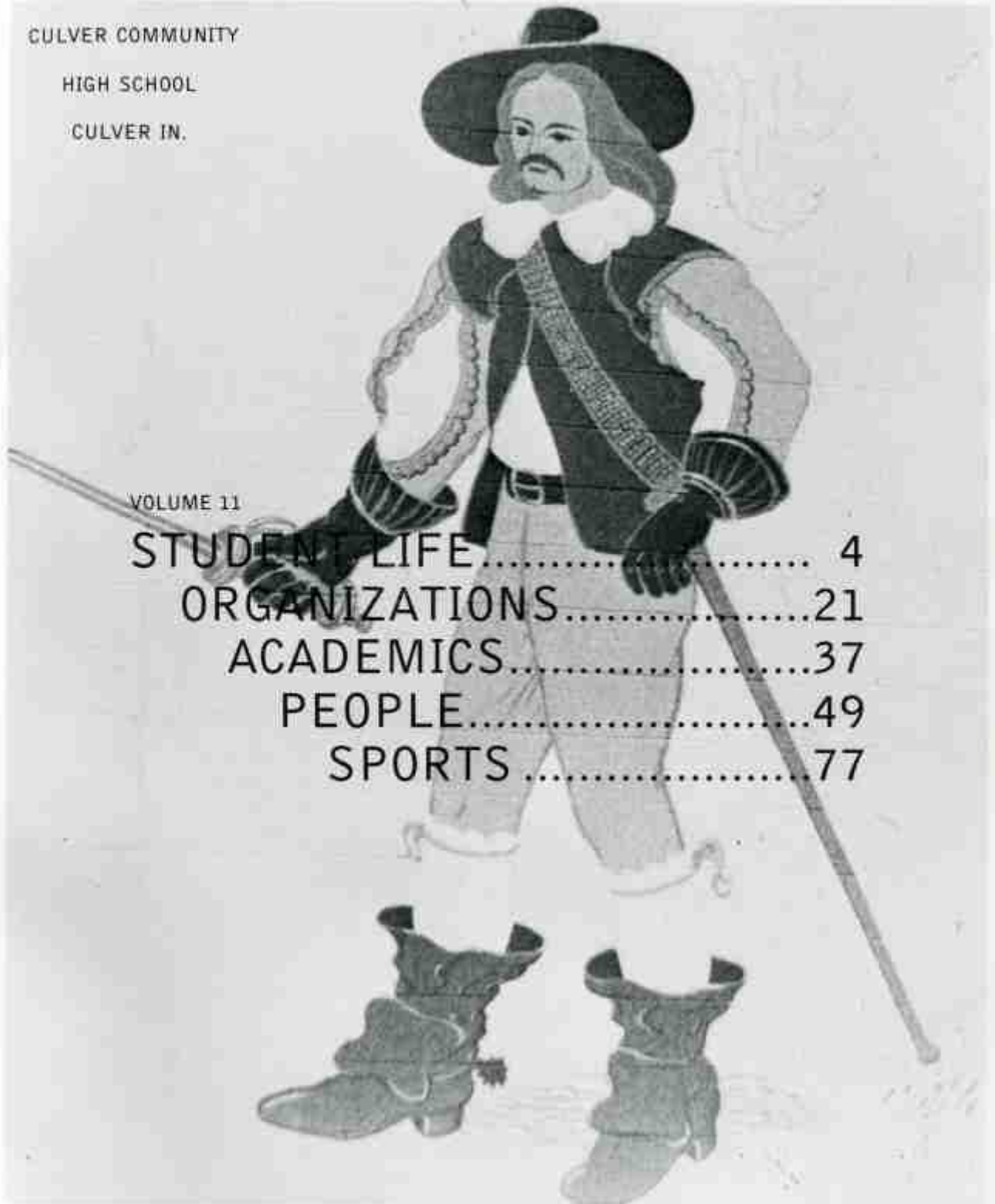

## "Looking For Space"

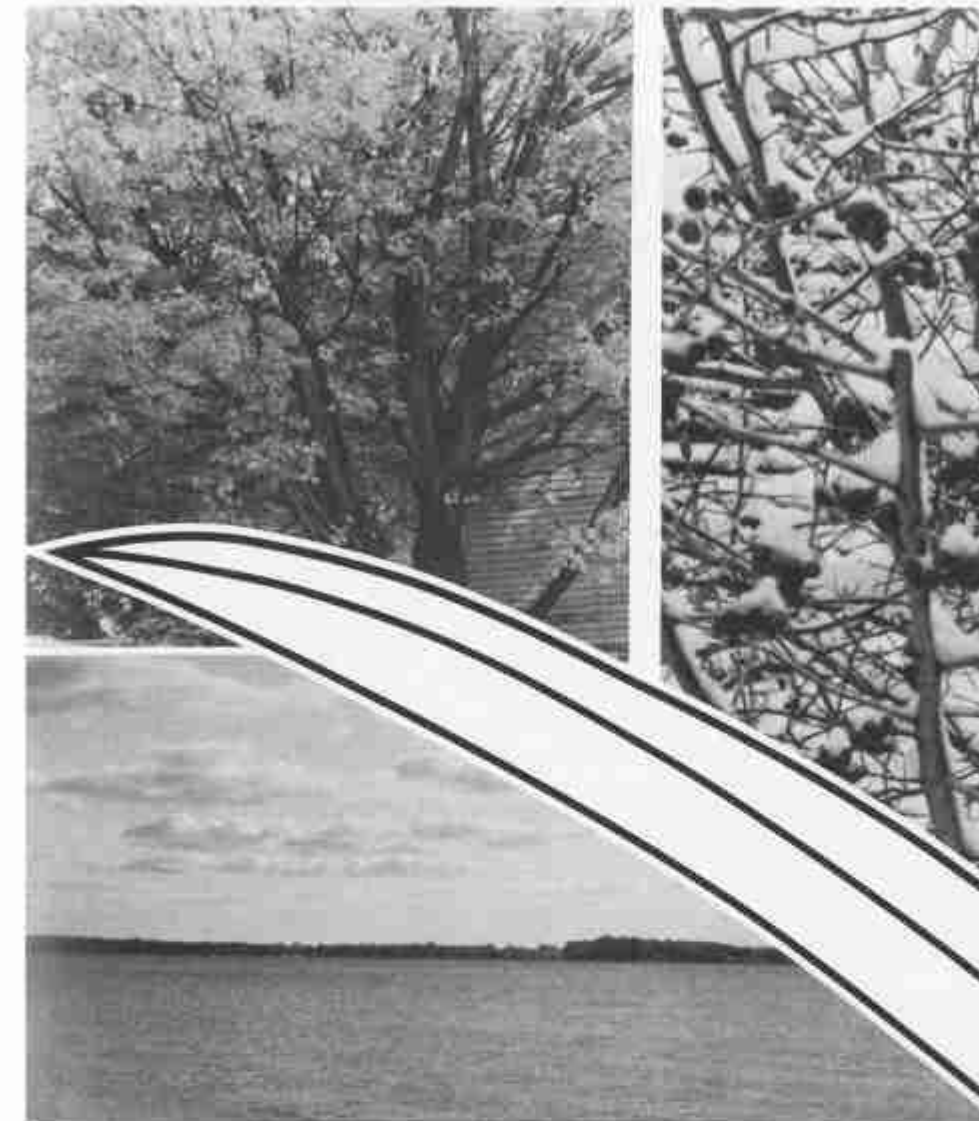

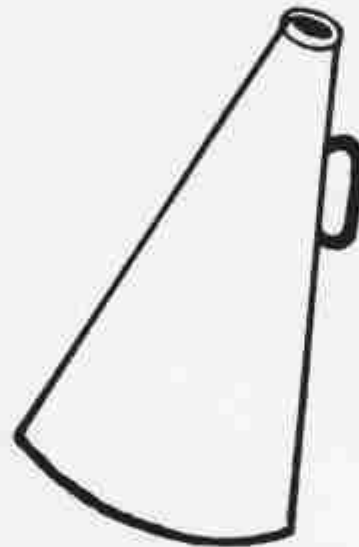

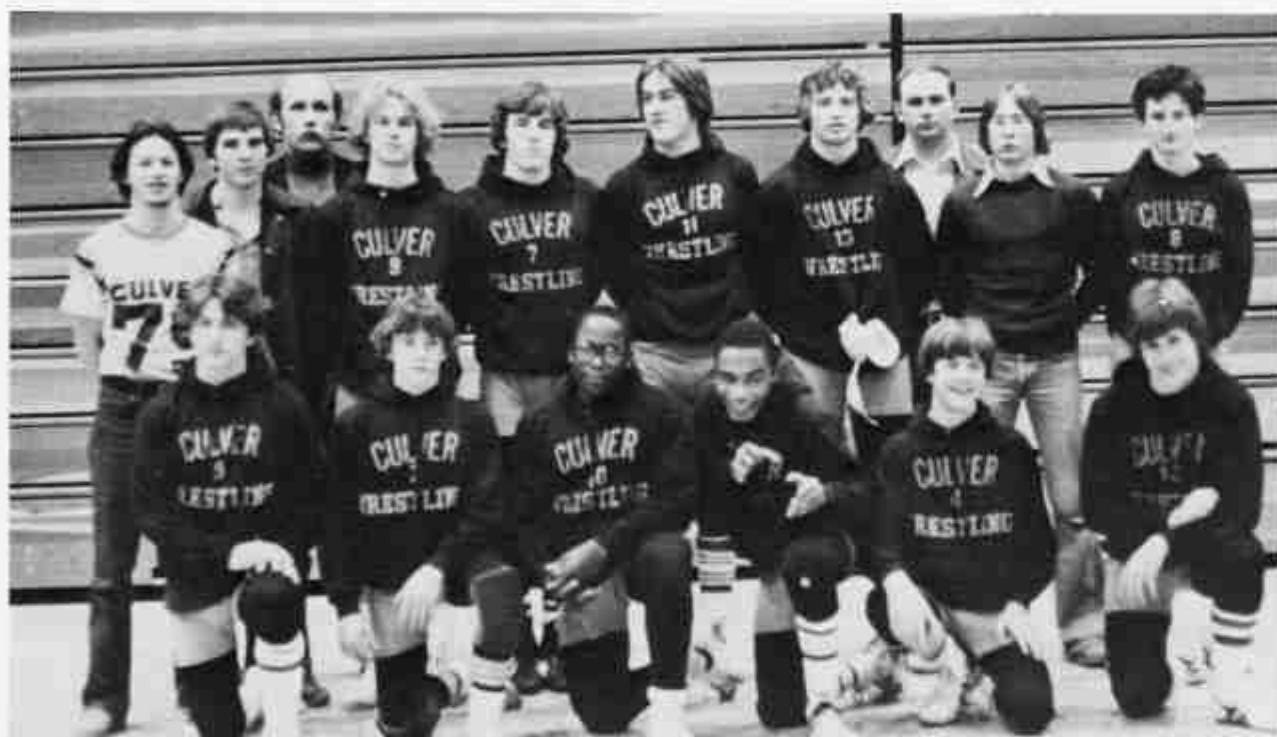
