
What's happening Bea? You'll always find Beatrice with a smile on her face.




"THE BLIZZARD OF "78"

Each year we seem to gain at least one new set of twins. I wonder how many we'll get next year.






WHERE WERE YOU WHEN THE LIGHTS WENT OUT?





Performance day had finally come. Nervousness overcame exhaustion from too little sleep.



These are the French Club members. They participated in the homecoming parade and in the window painting contest. Last spring they went and ate at a French restaurant. They plan to do so again this year.



The cross-country team finished the season with a 12-5 record. Along with this accomplishment the team placed third in the county, and 3rd in the conference.



There was a lot of hard practicing and work that went into the placing of third in the conference meet, and the second placing in the sectional.




