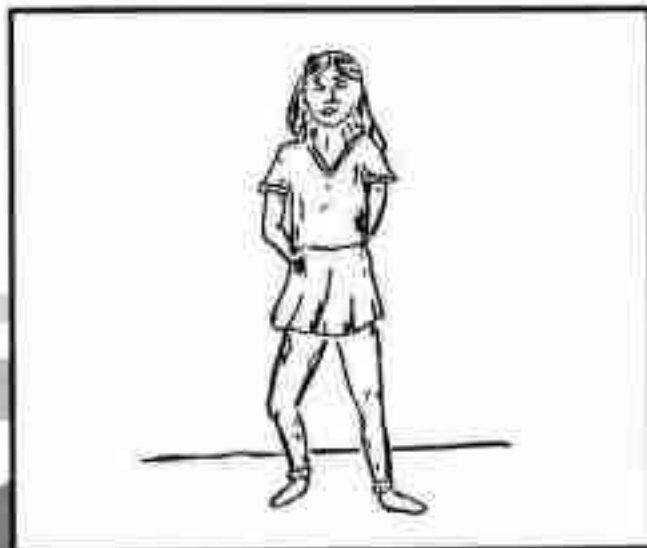

In fact, anything that makes them look attractive is against the rules.

Unwillingly, one of the girls, Diane Dodge, attracts a boy named Tony Cartwright. Tony follows her everywhere and once even disguises himself as a girl just so he can get into the sorority house to see her. Even though she could get kicked out, Diane finds herself liking Tony more and more.

Throughout Tony and Diane's escapades, Amy Lindstrom reads love letters, Regina Feathers practices her dying scene for the school play, Ethal Crabtree threatens people's lives, Muriel Dilby throws insults with Jane Stevens, Miss Brackie throws herself at Herman the Janitor, and Hortense Jones shows how much she hates men and comes up with ways to kill them all off.

The play ends hilariously when the founder of Zeta, Miss Helen Lestrade, comes for a visit. At the same time, Jonathon Cartwright comes to find his nephew, Tony. When Helen and Jonathon see each other, they discover that they know each other. In fact, they were engaged to be married 15 years ago. Miss Lestrade and Jonathon fell in love all over again, and Miss Lestrade promptly eliminates the no-men rule. The girls and Miss Brackie are ecstatic, and Diane and Tony walk off hand in hand and are at last together.

The Glass Menagerie is a Tennessee Williams classic. It is the story of a Southern belle named Amanda who lives in the past. She has two children, Tom and Laura, of whom she is very protective. Her daughter Laura is partially crippled and very shy. It is hard for her to show her true self.

Tom works at a factory job, but dreams of being on his own and "doing" something with his life.

Amanda can not adjust to either of her children's ideals. She has both of her children's lives planned out for them, and when they choose not to live by her expectations, she feels they have failed her.

As in many of Williams' plays, the characters in the "Glass Menagerie" were unhappy and had distorted ideals.

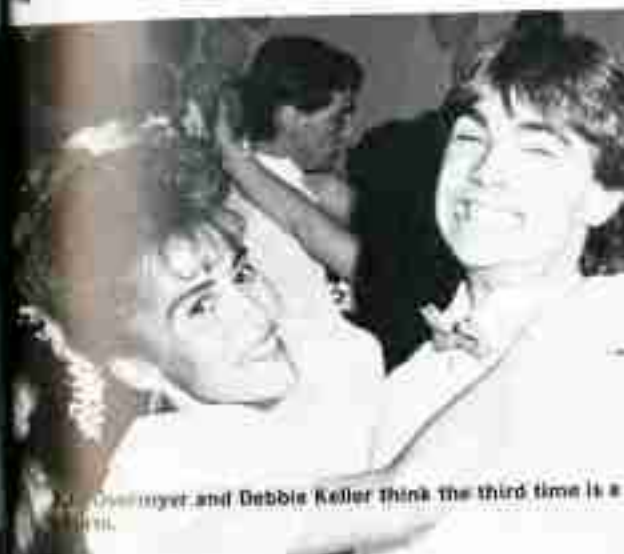

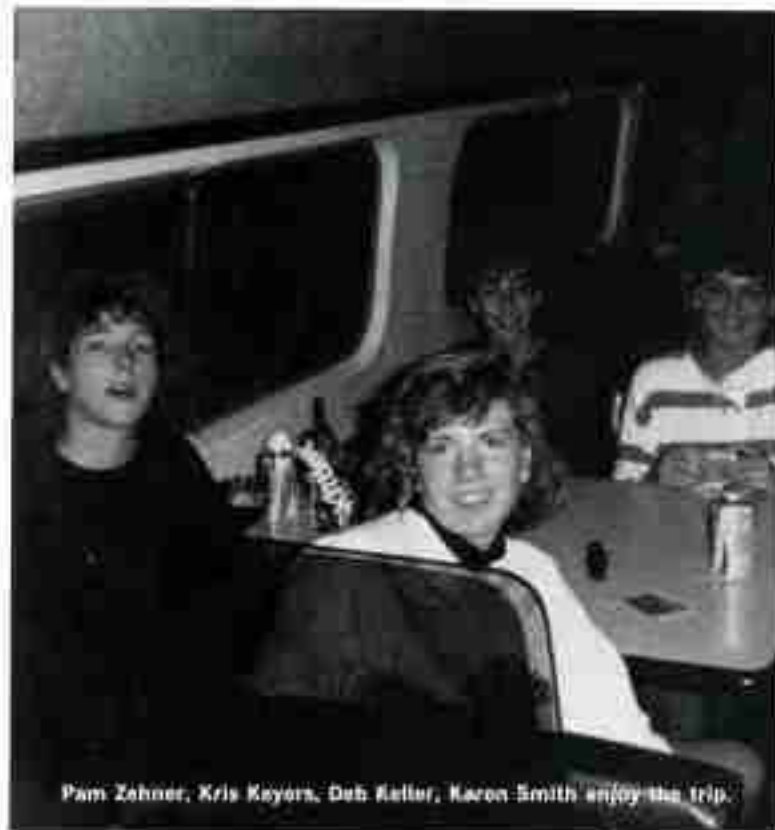

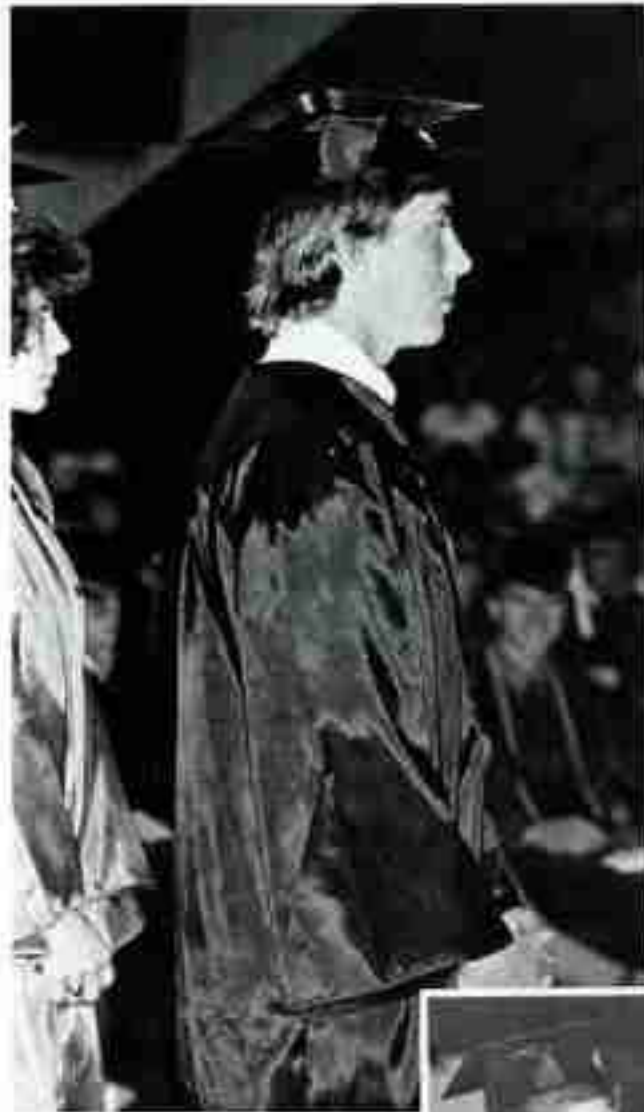

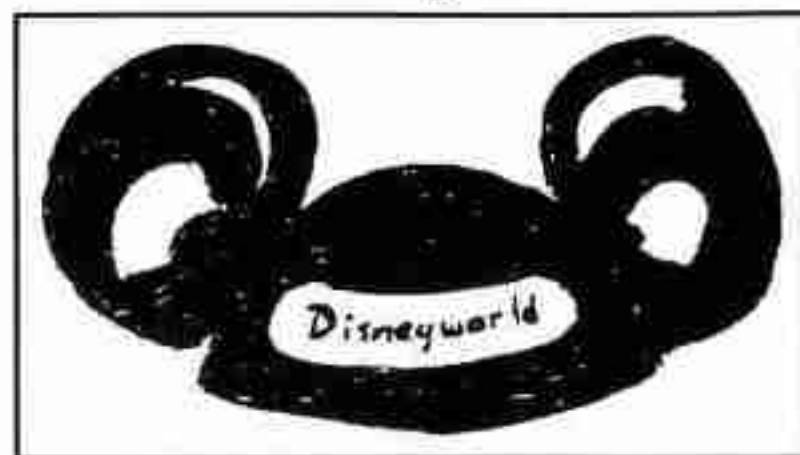

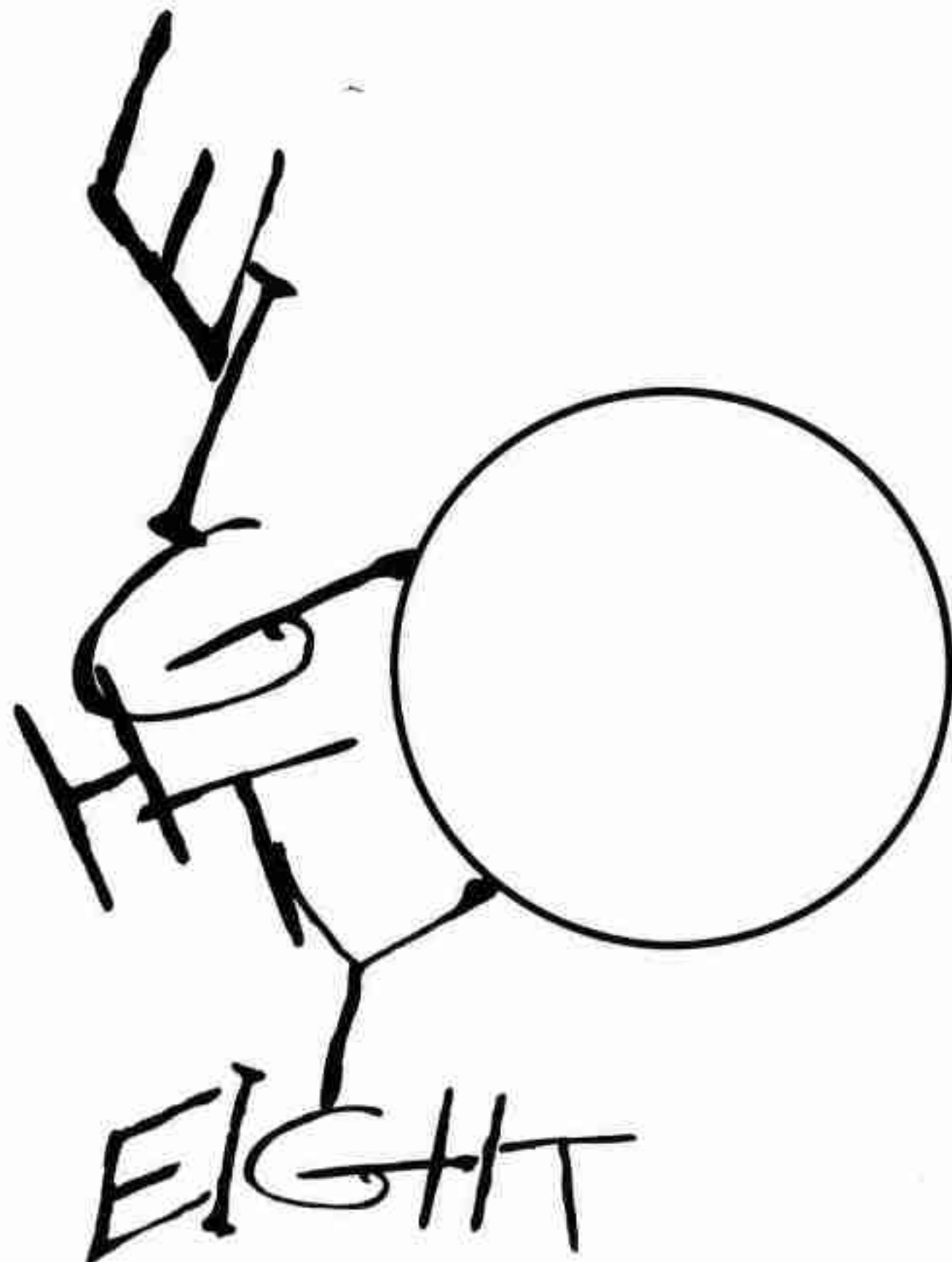

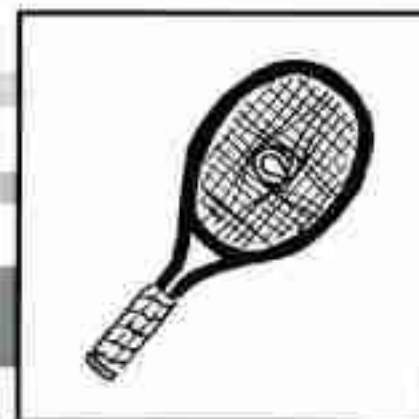

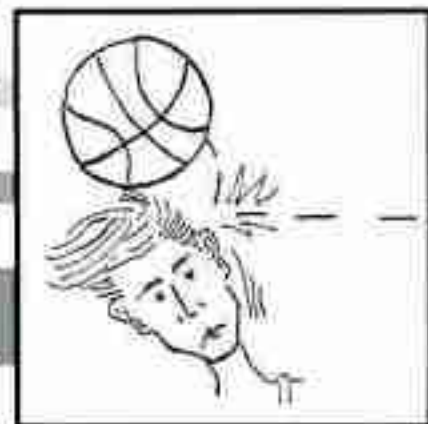

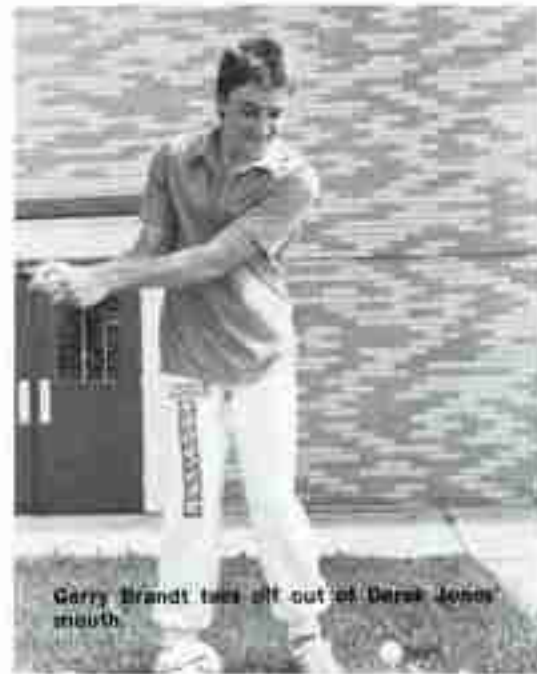

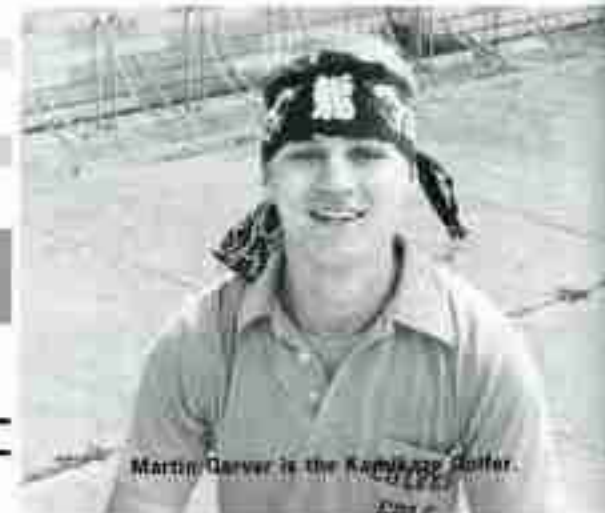
