Culver Community Schools Announces Registration And Opening Of School Events

Culver - The Administration of Culver Community Schools Corporation is completely staffed and ready for the opening of school this month. The following is information for students and parents related to opening of school.

All students attending Monterey and Culver Elementary, and the Culver Community Junior High School, should register and pay book rental fees for the coming year on Monday, August 20th; Tuesday, August 21st; and Wednesday, August 22nd. Parents should register their children at the school they will be attending. Registration will be from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on any of the three days.

Students entering school for the first time in either kindergarten or first grade will need to have a physical and all immunizations. A child must be five years of age on or before September 1st to be eligible for kindergarten, and six years of age on or before September 1st of the current year to be eligible for first grade.

Book rental fees for this year will be kindergarten, \$17.00; first grade - \$29.00; second grade - \$27.00; third grade - \$26.00; fourth grade - \$21.00; fifth grade - \$21.00; sixth grade - \$21.00; seventh grade - \$22.00; eighth grade - \$28.00.

The following plans are in operation for high school students to enroll: Students desiring schedule changes should make appointments for this purpose with Ruth Shanks, high school guidance counselor, immediately. Appointments may be held between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. in the counselor's office, at Culver Community High School. Orientation for high school students is scheduled in the auditorium on the following schedule: Seniors 9:00 a.m. August 20th; Juniors, 1:00 August 20th; Sophomores 9:00 a.m. August 21st and Freshmen 1:00 p.m. August 21st. Makeup session will be at 9:00 a.m. on August 22nd.

Following the orientation, students may pay book fees, purchase P.E. equipment, and get their class schedules. Schedule changes must be made prior to the payment of book fees at the bookstore. Fees will vary according to the classes which the student selects. Please note that no student

can pick up a schedule or attend any class until he has participated in orientation. All orientation sessions will begin on time and no late entrance is permitted. Most sessions will last about an hour-and-a-half. Parents are invited to attend these orientation sessions.

There will be no student registrations on Thursday, August 23; and Friday, August 24, since school personnel will be attending professional meetings. School will not be in session on Labor Day, September 3rd. Student supplemental insurance applications may be picked up along with applications for the free and reduced price lunch program at the time of registration. Applications for free textbooks and supplies may also be picked up at this time. Parents of students who have moved into the Culver Community Schools Corporation since the close of the school last spring and have not enrolled their children, should contact the principal's office for an appointment prior to the registration dates to complete their enrollment.

really ecstatic over Trent Bennett. Heath commented "Trent has been a real find for us. He's extremely talented for a freshman. He has a chance to be a starting defensive end for us. If that were to happen, it would prove what a competitor he really is and be unbelievable to me. For a freshman to start on defense and on the line, that's unbelievable but possible."

The meeting closed with the formal prayer circle.

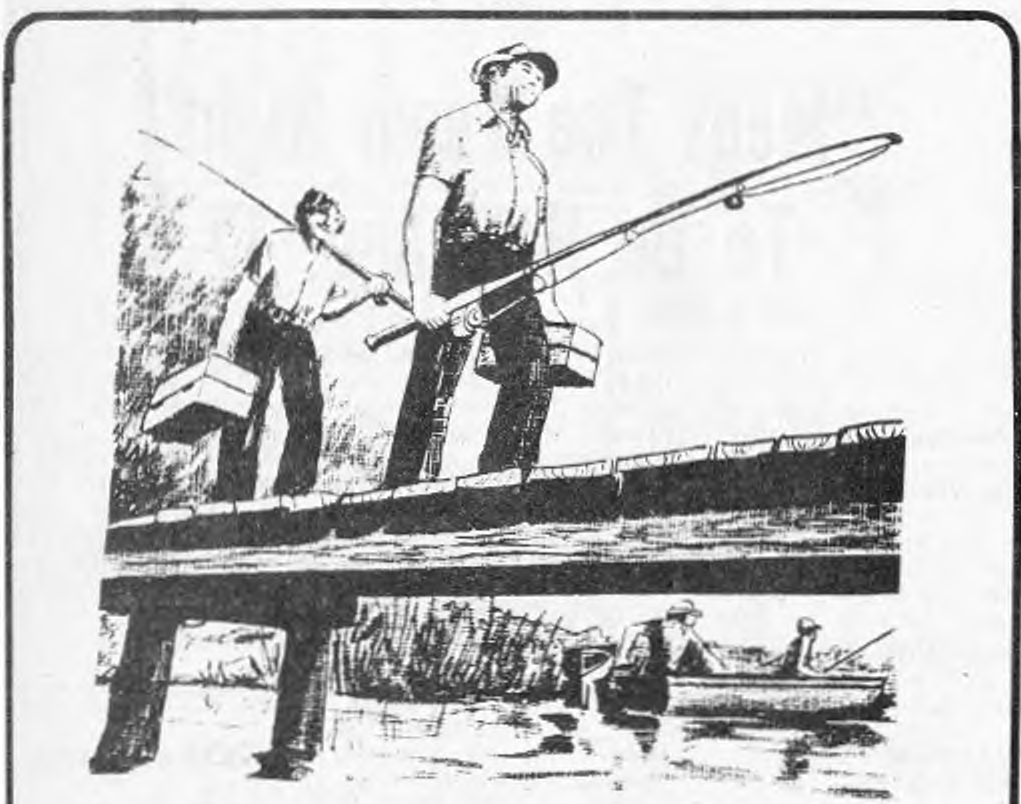

FIFTH GRADERS LOW COST ENERGY MEASURES

Low-cost, simple energy conservation methods save the United States as much as 2.5 trillion barrels of oil a day, Congressman Phil Fithian said today.

Fithian outlined a variety of measures in his weekly commentary, "Eye on Washington," which could save energy, be implemented with little or no cost, and interestingly save consumers hundreds of dollars each year.

The methods were part of the Department of Energy legislation before the Environment, Energy and Natural Resources Subcommittee, of which Fithian is a member.

"Our subcommittee has faulted DOE for not paying more attention to such energy-saving measures," Fithian said. "Americans are willing to do their part for conservation, particularly when conservation will save precious dollars too."

The Congressman reported that many Hoosiers ask what they can do personally to conserve energy.

No-cost conservation methods cited include: washing clothes in cold water and line drying them; turning off lights when leaving a room; saving about \$84 annually by lowering the temperature setting on water heaters, which saves from \$50 to \$200, opening and closing curtains to cut summer heat and recycle winter heat, saving \$25; and setting thermostats at 78 in the summer and 65 in the winter, saving a minimum of \$50.

Installation of "low cost controllers" to save on hot water in half of the homes in America could save an estimated 60 million barrels of oil a day. Fithian's new free publication, Home Experimenters' How-to-do-it Clipbook on Alcohol Fuels.

The clipbook a collection of magazine article reprints and government documents on alcohol fuel production and experiments, provides basic back-to-earth advice on setting up your own experimental alcohol fuel plant.

Scale drawings of actual home built alcohol fuel plants, advice on obtaining necessary government permits, and other helpful information is provided.
