Culver - The Administraion of Culver Community chools Corporation ompletely staffed and ready or the opening of school his month. The following is nformation for students and arents related to opening f school.

All students attending Aonterey and Elementary, and the Culver community Junior High chool, should register and ay book rental fees for the oming year on Monday, lugust 20th; Tuesday, august lugust 21st; and Wednesday august 22nd. Parents should egister their children at the chool they will be attending. legistration will be from :00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on ny of the three days.

Students entering school or the first time in either indergarten or first grade vill need to have a physical nd all immunizations. A conta must be five years of age on or before September 1st to be eligible for kinder-garten, and on or before years of age 1st of the current September eligible for first grade, to be

Book rental fees for this registration dates to compyear will be kindergarten, \$17.00; first grade - \$29.00; Second grade - \$27.00; third grade - \$26.00; fourth grade -\$21.00; fifth grade - \$21.00; sixth grade - \$21.00; seventh grade - \$22.00; eighth grade

The following plans are in operation for high school students to enroll: Students desiring schedule changes should make appointments for this purpose with Ruth Shanks, high school guidance counselor, immediately. Appointments may be held between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. in the counselor's office, at Culver Community High School.

Orientation for high school students is scheduled in the auditorium on the following schedule: Seniors 9:00 a.m. August 20th; Juniors, 1:00 August 20th; Sophomores 9:00 a.m. August 21st and Freshmen 1:00 p.m. August 21st. Makeup session will be at 9:00 a.m. on August 22nd.

Following the orientation, students may pay book fees, purchase P.E. equipment, and get their class schedules. Schedule changes must be made prior to the payment of book fees at the bookstore. Fees will vary according to the classes which the student selects. Please note that no student can pick up a schedule or attend any class until he has participated in orientation. All orientation sessions will begin on time and no late entrance is permitted. Most sessions will last about an hour-and-a-half. Parents are invited to attend these orientation sessions.

There will be no student registrations on Thursday. August 23; and Friday, August 24, since school personnel will be attending professional meetings. School will not be in session on Labor Day, September 3rd Student supplemental insurance applications may be picked up along with applications for the free and reduced price lunch program at the time of registration. Applications for free textbooks and supplies may also be picked up at this time. Parents of students who have moved into the Culver Community Schools Corporation since the close of the school last spring and have not enrolled their children, should contact the principal's office for an appointment prior to the

Transportation will not be provided for registration sessions. Classes will begin on Monday, August 27, 1979. School buses will run beginning Monday, August 27, and pick up students in time to have them arrive at their respective schools shortly after 8:00 a.m. This will be a regular full day of

Lunches will be served in all cafeterias beginning Monday, August 27th. The price of lunches will be grades 1-6, 50¢; grades 7-12, 55¢; and adult lunches,

All teaching and noninstructional positions for the 1979-80 school year have been filled. There is still a need for substitute bus drivers. Anyone interested in working as a substitute bus driver should contact the superintendent's office as soon as possible.


