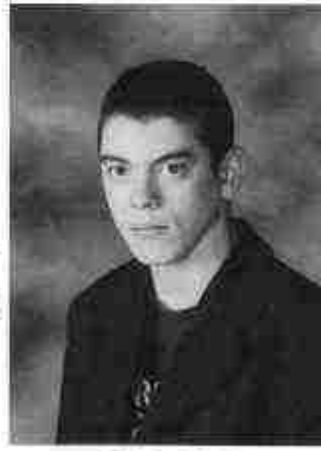

Can you imagine a team with less than five players on it? This year the Cavalier Cross-Country Team ran strong with only three members. Jesse Good was the only returning runner while Jordan Broecker and Matt Ogden were newcomers. Even though it was a three-man team, Coach Barb Stevens had high hopes for them. The team relied on each other at practice to reach their goals throughout the season. This strategy worked; therefore, runners improved their times by the end of the season. 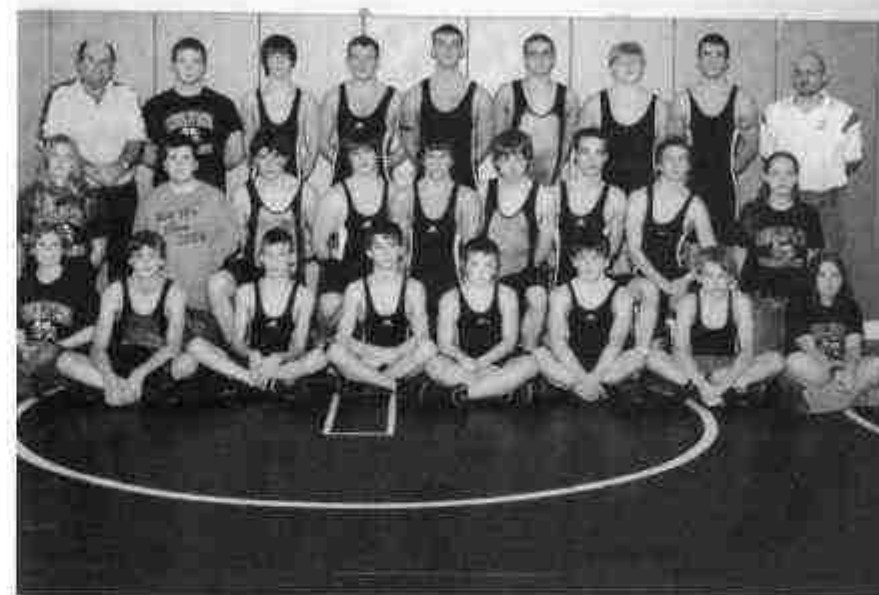

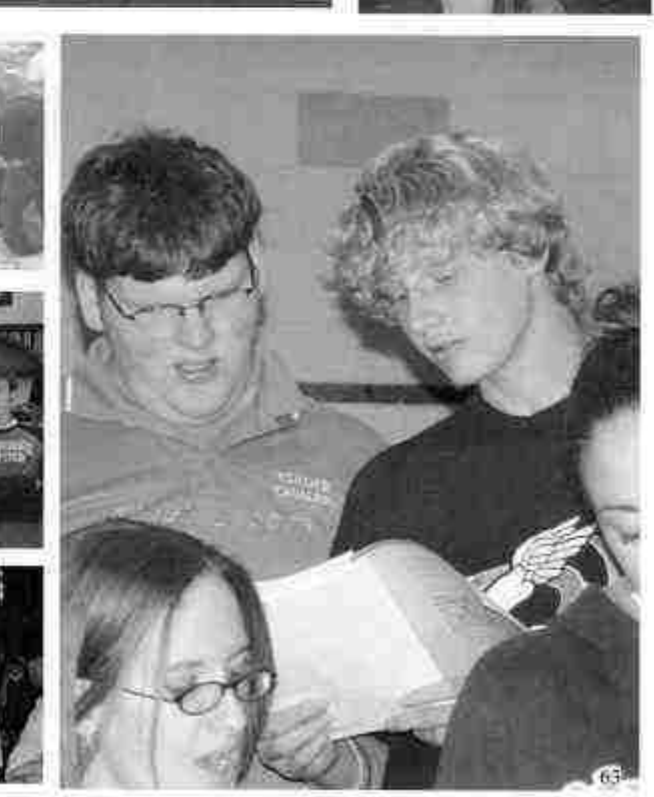

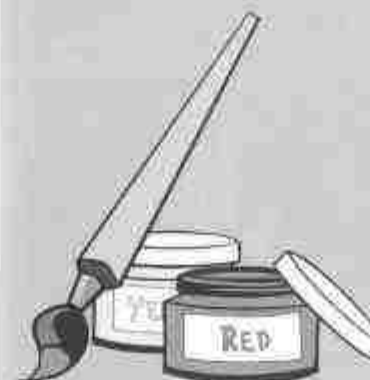

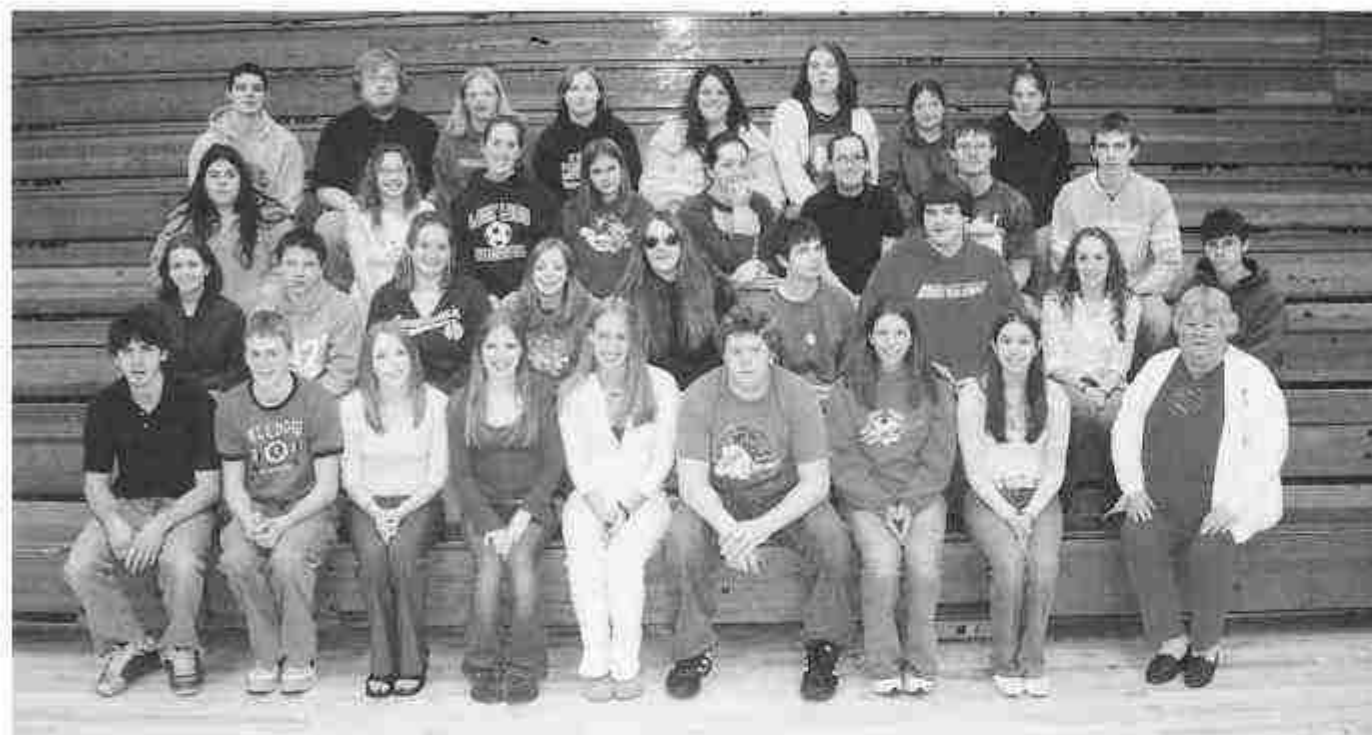

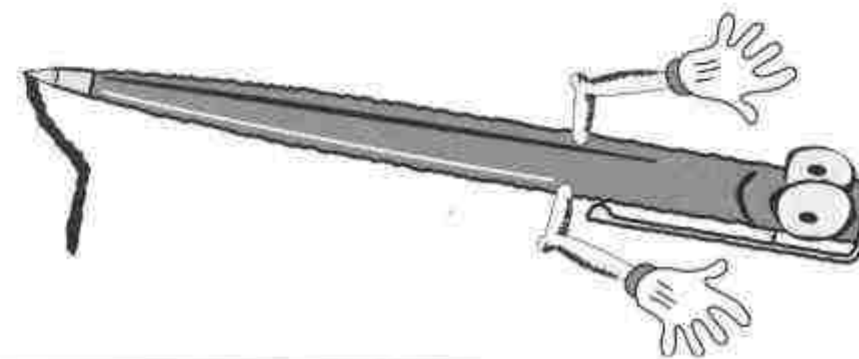

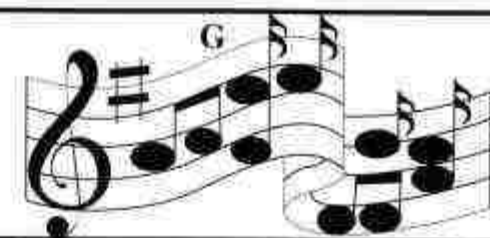
