## Deathbed Drama

It was a scene fit for the movies. Old Mr. Watkins lay dying. His will was rushed to his dying. His will was rushed to his
hospital room, ready for signing. But as he was in the act of inscribing his name, his strength ailed him.
"Help me finish," he whispered.
A friend stepped to the bedside, held the dying man's hand, and helped him complete the signature.
Was the will valid? A court raled that it was indeed, even hough Watkins had not been able to finish the name himself. The court said there could be no douht, under the circumstances, hat the signature was his own voluntary affirmation of the will


Sooner or later, death overtakes us all. Yet, people persist in watiting ontil their final nosments to make a will.
Ohviously, this heightens the chance of a slip-up. Consider another deatibed case:
At ekderly widow alsu felt her strength ebbing white she was part way through her signature. But instead of asking for assistance, she merely lay hack and stid:
just can'I sign it now." She never did fintish. In due course, her heirs tried to extablish the validity of the will on (le hasis of the partial signature But this time, their efforts were in vain. The court said the widow's own words indicated that the did not consider the docu ment complete.
In a third case, a man had already lapsed into unconsciousness by the time the witt was brought to bis bedside. Here too a friend held his hand and guided a friend held
Afterward, everyone agreed that the will had been drawn up in accordance with his instructions. Nevertheless, a court found the man's will null and void. The signature didn't become his, siill the court, merely because his hand was in physical contact with the pen while his name was being written.
"There was no magic in his touch," said the court. "Both its power and the inteligence necessary to direct it were in a state of suspension."

## NEW HONOR ROLL SYSTEM

Our usual honor roll sysiem was ceplaced this vear by a new hopefully more efficient system. To be eligible for the Academic Honor roll you can have no grade lower than a " C ". and for every there must be a corresponding " $A$ ". There are seven categories 6A. 5A, 4A, 3A, 2A, 1A, and Honorable Mention. Honorable Mention is a straight " $B$ " average These students not only obtain the pride of being on the honor roll, but prid a reward anywhere from a complimentary ticket to the theatre to a free ice cream bar in the school cafeteria to a hearty hand shake from the principal.
At the end of our next nine week period an Achievement Honor Rol will be brought into the school. To be eligible, a student must raise his grades at least 8 points. A point given for each fraction of a grade he raises his previous nine week grade (Ex: a "C" raised to a " $\mathrm{C}+$ is one point, a " $B$ " raised to an s one point, a $B$ raised to an $A$ is three points).
