I wish to propose a solution to Culver's Dilemma. We have too many talented elderly persons with nothing to do. Some of them are well established financially, others struggling with retirement inflation problems. The Senior Citizens meet weekly at the Grace Church, through the graciousness of the pastor and the board of trustees. These people need a home of their own as a full time recreation center. A place where they can play games, read, sit on the old-fashioned porch and watch the girls and boys go by, or to just "listen to the hardening of their arteries!"

Let's do something for them. Culver is largely a community of retired persons and a bedroom community for citizens who commute and work in other areas. The retired citizens, many on fixed incomes, deserve a meeting place of their own. Various organizations are also quite concerned. Aside from the lodges, every organization needs a place for an office and a headquarters.

The Culver Hotel, now vacant, is at the heart of our community, located in downtown Culver. In addition to The State Exchange Bank, the Post Office, the new Hook's Drug Store, the area includes the library and many nearby businesses. There is ample parking, especially at night. We should take advantage of the Hotel facilities, which are now vacant. The hotel building is in good repair and could be classified as a national landmark, to be preserved as a historical old-time country hotel. It was originally a school house. Federal funds can be obtained for its restoration and preservation.

Presented to the Culver Public Library by Mr. and Mrs. Donald M. Overmyer, presently of Fort Wayne and formerly of Burr Oak, is the OVERMYER HISTORY AND GENEALOGY.

The accumulation of nostalgic material and photographs is a fine historical account of an interesting family, compiled by Barnhart B. and John C. Overmyer in 1905.

The authors start with the origin of the "Obermayer" family of the 680's in Germany and continue with the emigration to America in 1751, and the settlement in Pennsylvania. The biographical details and family sketches are plentiful, and a very good index is an excellent asset.

The many relatives and friends of the Overmyer family will find this book fascinating browsing and the genealogy buff will find it very helpful for research.

Paddle Your Own Canoe At Canoe Race!

Over 200 canoeists will be gathering in Spencer Saturday and Sunday, June 15th and 16th, to compete in the 1974 Annual White River Canoe Race.

White River flows diagonally through Morgan and Owen counties. Tracing the watery route used by Indian tribes of this area, the White River Canoe Race course runs through the town of Gosport, McCormick's Creek State Park, and several historical and scenic attractions.

Sponsored by the Spencer Chamber of Commerce, the canoe races range from one to twenty miles in length and include events for all age groups. The White River Canoe Race is sanctioned by both the Indiana Canoe Racing Council and the United States Canoe Association.

Some of the canoe races will be held strictly for fun and entertainment, while others will be for trophies and/or for points counted in the U.S. Canoe Association's national standings.

Focal point for both days' activities will be the White River Bridge at the south end of Spencer.

For spectators and participants wanting to attend both days of racing, McCormick's Creek State Park is located one mile east of Spencer and provides hotel, swimming, camping and other recreational facilities. Races will start at 11:00 a.m. Saturday and Sunday with heats and positions being determined at a drawing prior to the start of each race.

Saturday's racing agenda includes a one-mile Singles Championship in Cruising at 11:00 a.m.; Aluminum Canoe Race for ten miles at 1:00 p.m.; a ten-mile Mixed Couples Cruising event at

2:00 p.m.; and a One Man Kayak ten-mile race at 2:30 p.m.

At 3:00 p.m., a Non-Trophy Winner race will be held especially for canoeists from the Spencer community to encourage local participation.

Concluding Saturday's racing events at 4:30 p.m. will be the C-4 Sprint Race. This one-mile race is open class with four men per canoe. Patches will be awarded to all canoeists at the time of registration, with trophies being presented to winners of both days of racing on Sunday afternoon after the Senior Men's Championship Race at Cooper's Park in Spencer.

Sunday's racing opens at 11:00 a.m. with the Senior Women's Cruising - a ten-mile race from Gosport to Cooper's Park, followed by the nineteen-mile Junior Men's Cruising at 12:00 noon, and the Senior Men's Cruising race (also nineteen miles) at 12:30 p.m.

For two action-filled days of canoeing, picnicking, or just plain relaxing and watching the races, be

sure to visit Spencer's White River Canoe Race June 15th and 16th.

THE FAMILY LAWYER

Curfew

Curfew laws, designed to keep youngsters off the streets at night, have been around for almost 100 years. But only recently have the courts been taking a close look at their validity. Does a city have the legal authority to put limits on anybody's freedom of movement?



The basic idea has generally been approved. One youth, arrested under a curfew law, challenged it as a form of discrimination against younger people. But the court pointed out that minors are lawfully singled out with regard to everything from marrying to driving, from attending school to buying liquor.

Upholding the law, the court said: "Children are under recognized disabilities in many respects. Because of their lack of mature judgment, they are subject to continuing supervision until they become of age." Nevertheless, a curfew law may be struck down if it is too broad. Another case involved a curfew

that banned all minors from the streets after 10 p.m., with almost no leeway for exceptional circumstances.

In a court test, the judge noted that this law could punish youngsters coming home from evening classes, from work at the library, from school games or dances, even from church activities.

Finding the law invalid, the court said it violated "the right of every person to enjoy and engage in lawful and innocent activity."

In one recent case, police booked the father of a 16-year-old boy for "allowing" him to be out after the curfew hour.

The court conceded that it was constitutional to punish the parent in such a situation. However, it seems the father had been told—and had honestly believed—that his son was spending the night at the home of a friend. Dismissing the charge against the father, the court said he could not have "allowed" conduct of which he was not even aware.
